

Steering Committee Charter

Overview

The Steering Committee is comprised of leadership from key Pathways to Health + Home partner organizations. The committee is responsible for providing advisory oversight to the Support Team and thought leadership and strategic recommendations to the Executive Committee through quarterly reports. The Steering Committee will meet once a month for the duration of the program.

Purpose

Key objectives of the Steering Committee include, but are not limited to:

- Informing the provider readiness assessment
- Providing input and feedback on target population eligibility criteria
- Identifying service gaps and providing recommendations on which providers should fill them
- Engaging directly with governance committees to provide feedback and recommendations on program design
- Monitoring progress on program outcomes
- Identifying implementation and service delivery challenges, as well as solutions
- Reviewing program evaluation and outcomes data
- Ensuring timely implementation of the program
- Identifying key stakeholders that should be engaged
- Informing Executive Committee funding decisions
- Aligning Pathways to Health + Home with existing homeless and related health care initiatives and services

Steering Committee Alternates

- Each Steering Committee organization selects or appoints a representative in a leadership role who can drive organizational change and names an alternate to the committee.

Terms

- For those members who represent a government department, that person may serve as long as they continue to hold the same job/position.
- For those members who represent a partner organization, that person may serve as long as the organization participates in the program and the representative continues to hold the same leadership position.
- In the event that an individual leaves an organization, a new delegate with the same/similar position can be assigned to the Steering Committee.
